Bodywork and car finish	
 Exterior cleaning of the vehicle (check seams, joints, wheel arches & trim) Hard wax sealing of paint damage, paint chips and stone chips Treatment of rubber and door seals Examination of the underbody for rust spots, treat if necessary Use of a cotton car cover (fixed) 	00000
💥 Wheels and chassis	
 Increase tire pressure to 3 - 4 bar Storage of the vehicle on trestles Lubricating the vehicle joints with a grease gun Release of the handbrake Examination of the wheel arches and wishbones for rust spots, treat if necessar 	() () () () ()
Battery Battery	
 Removal of the battery, charge at regular intervals (about every two months) Battery storage: cool, dry and at a constant temperature Tip: Use of a trickle charger is advantageous 	0
lnterior	
 Cleaning of the interior (wipe out with a damp cloth and dry again) Checking the footwell for wet spots Opening of the windows (approximately 2-3 cm) Preparation of the leather components Cabriolet roof always closed 	00000
Engine and gearbox	
 Use of antifreeze Change of engine and transmission oil, <u>ZF lubricant list</u> Filling up the vehicle tank Check spark plugs, change if necessary Tip: use a fuel stabilizer when the vehicle is stationary for long periods
