



Appendix 4: Local specific lead times

Valid for location Lebring / Division C

Version: 26.07.2016

- Transport days are the days of the week, namely from Monday until Friday. Saturdays, Sundays and holidays extend the stated due dates by the respective number of days.
- The named lead times start with the transport notification of the shipment. The time of transportation starts with the provision of the goods.
- Loading and unloading is in general not possible on Saturdays. Some receiving plants can define Saturday as a loading and/or unloading day in the local specification temporarily or permanently.
- Lead times for outgoing shipments (e.g. empties, return shipments, etc.) are not the same as those for the incoming goods shipments because the empty packaging will be cleaned and consolidated by a service provider at a different location. Empties have the same priority as incoming shipments.
- If the transport service provider is not able to meet the planned pick up date, he has to inform the material planner proactively. This has to be done as well if a transport is delayed and the planned delivery date cannot be met. In such cases, adjustments need to be clarified with the material planner.
